

**USTA National Junior Ranking System**  
**NATIONAL RANKING POINT TABLES, Effective January 1, 2015**

There are seven separate tables for tournaments, based on draw type, as follows:

- Main Draw with a Feed-in Championship through Quarterfinals
- Main Draw with a Feed-in Championship through Round of 16
- Main Draw with a Feed-in Championship through Semifinals
- Single Elimination Main Draw or Main Draw with a non-Feed-in Championship Consolation
- USTA National Masters
- Team Tournament

**Main Draw with a Feed-in Championship (FIC) through Quarterfinals**

*This Point Table is used for the singles events at USTA Boys' & Girls 18 & 16 National Championships (Level 1). It may also be used at one of the tournaments that are designated by each Section as Level 3 or 4 National Ranking Tournaments.*

Ranking Points are earned based on the player result in the tournament – the champion receives the Ranking Points in the champion row, a player who reaches the FIC Round of 32 receives the Ranking Points in the FIC Round of 32 row. Any Bonus Points earned are added to this total. Withdrawals, walkovers, retirements, defaults, and disqualifications count as wins; byes do not count as wins. A player must win a round to receive Ranking Points in a tournament.

**Main Draw with a Feed-in Championship (FIC) through Round of 16**

*This Point Table is used for the singles events USTA National Selection Tournaments (Level 2), USTA Regional Tournaments (Level 4), the Easter Bowl (Level 1A), and the Warm Up Tournaments (Level 3). It may also be used at one of the tournaments that are designated by each Section as Level 3 or 4 National Ranking Tournaments.*

Ranking Points are earned based on the player result in the tournament – the champion receives the Ranking Points in the champion row, a player who reaches the FIC Round of 32 receives the Ranking Points in the FIC Round of 32 row. Any Bonus Points earned are added to this total. Withdrawals, walkovers, retirements, defaults, and disqualifications count as wins; byes do not count as wins. A player must win a round to receive Ranking Points in a tournament.

**Main Draw with a Feed-in Championship (FIC) through Semifinals**

*Although not used on the national level, this draw format and Point Table may be used at any of the 6 tournaments that are designated by each Section as Level 3 or 4 National Ranking Tournaments. There are no Level 1, Level 1A or Level 2 National Ranking Tournaments with this draw format. Also, the singles draws at USTA Regional Tournaments do not use this FIC through Semifinals format; they use the FIC through Quarterfinals format.*

Ranking Points are earned based on the player result in the tournament – the champion receives the Ranking Points in the champion row, a player who reaches the FIC Round of 32 receives the Ranking Points in the FIC Round of 32 row. Any Bonus Points earned are added to this total. Withdrawals, walkovers, retirements, defaults, and disqualifications count as wins; byes do not count as wins. A player must win a round to receive Ranking Points in a tournament.

**Single Elimination Main Draw****or Main Draw with a Non-Feed-in Championship Consolation**

Non-Feed-In Championship Consolation Formats Include: First Match Losers Consolation (FMLC); First Round Losers Consolation (FRLC); Modified Feed-in Championship (MFIC); Compass Draw

*This Point Table is used, for example, for the Compass Draw singles events at all USTA Boys' & Girls' 14 & 12 National Championships (Level 1), the USTA National Sweet Sixteen (Level 1A) and the USTA National Doubles Championships (Level 1). It is also the table used for all single elimination doubles events at USTA National Championships (Level 1), USTA National Selection Tournaments (Level 2), USTA Regional Tournaments (Level 4), the Easter Bowl (Level 1A) and the Warm Up Tournaments (Level 3). The singles elimination ITF events that count for national ranking also use this table. The table may also be used at one of the tournaments that are designated by each Section as National Ranking Tournaments.*

Ranking Points are earned based on the player result in the main draw and the number of consolation matches won. Any Bonus Points earned are added to this total. Withdrawals, walkovers, retirements, defaults, and disqualifications count as wins; byes do not count as wins. A player must win a round to receive Ranking Points in a tournament.

Compass Draw Examples: The players who advance in the East Draw earn the Main Draw ranking points. Wins in all other draws earn the points for winning consolation rounds. For example, at a USTA National Championship, a Level 1 tournament, a player who loses their first round, but then wins three non-East Draw matches earns:

0 points (from East Draw)

+360 points (for 3 consolation wins - 120 points x 3)

=360 total Ranking Points for the tournament

Non-Compass Draw Examples: The champion receives the Ranking Points in the champion row. A player who reaches the Round of 16 and then wins one consolation match receives the Ranking Points in the Reached Round of 16 row plus the points earned for winning one consolation round. In a Level 2 National Ranking tournament this would be:

210 points (from Round of 16 finish in main draw)

+ 60 points (for 1 consolation win)

= 270 total Ranking Points for the tournament

**Team Tournaments**

*This Point Table is used, for example, for the following Level 1 and 2 National Ranking Tournaments:*

- USTA Boys & Girls 18 National Team Championships (Level 1)
- USTA Boys & Girls 16 & 14 Intersectional Team Championships (Level 1)
- USTA National Spring Team Championships (Level 1)
- USTA Zone Team Championships (Level 2)
- USTA Jr. Team Tennis Advanced Division National Championships - U18 & U14 (Level 4)

*It is also used for any Sectional team tournament designated Level 3 or 4.*

Ranking Points earned are based on the position a player is on a team. Any Bonus Points earned will be added to this total. For example, if a player in Position #1 on the team has four wins at a Level 2 tournament, and one of the wins results earns 50 Bonus Points, the player will earn 650 total Ranking Points for the tournament (150 points x 4 wins + 50 Bonus Points).

USTA National Spring Team Championships: This team tournament has two players from each of the 18s, 16s, 14s, and 12s divisions on each team. The #1 18s, 16s, 14s, and 12s player on each team shall earn Position #1 points for each win; the #2 18s, 16s, 14s, and 12s player on each team shall earn Position #2 points for each win.

## USTA National Masters

### 14s Division Bracket

4 players compete in the 14s, in a First Match Loser Consolation draw. The winner advances to the 16s bracket. Each player has two matches in this bracket.

<b>Winner</b>	500
<b>2nd Place</b>	250
<b>Consolation Win</b> <i>Maximum of 1 Consolation Match Played</i>	100

### 16s Division Bracket

8 players compete in the 16s - the 14s winner and 7 16s players. The draw is First Match Loser Consolation. The two finalists advance to the 18s bracket. Only one consolation match is played. Each player has two matches in this bracket.

<b>2 Finalists</b>	500
<b>Semifinalist</b>	250
<b>Consolation Win</b> <i>Maximum of 1 Consolation Match Played</i>	100

### 18s Division Bracket

16 players compete in the 18s - the 16s finalists and 14 18s players. The draw is a Compass Draw and is played to completion.

<b>Champion</b>	2000
<b>2nd Place</b>	1500
<b>3rd Place</b>	1000
<b>4th Place/SF</b>	700
<b>Quarterfinalist</b>	360
<b>Points per Consolation Win</b>	100
